The IUCN Guidelines will provide an essential guide to understanding and resolving human-wildlife conflict and provide the vital foundations and principles for good practice, with clear, practical guidance on how best to tackle conflicts and enable coexistence with wildlife. In parallel, we are jointly developing a set of Case Studies to illustrate key principles of HWC management.

This webinar series will provide an opportunity to link the theory of principles in HWC management with practical experience and insights from projects on the ground. Each webinar will focus on a particular aspect of HWC management and provide an opportunity for an in-depth discussion on lessons learned, insights, potential pitfalls, and practical advice from HWC practitioners and the IUCN SSC Human-Wildlife Conflict & Coexistence Specialist Group.

This webinar will focus on community-led management of wildlife impacts via a discussion of three Case Studies from Zimbabwe and India. The virtual format will enable questions, comments and inputs from the speakers, panellists, and virtual audience.
